a liberal-minded monarch who enjoyed the theater and wrote plays for special performances. Shakespeare gave 32 performances at her court during her reign.

King James I


(reigned from 1603 to 1625)

Shakespeare).


Only major disasters in Shakespeare's time were the plagues of 1592-94 and 1613, which closed the theaters.

He probably attended the free grammar school until 15, mainly studying LATIN. Read much Mythology, Ovid, Plutarch's Lives, etc., which he used as sources.



He wrote easily—to please the audience—intuitively, creatively—his characters real.

18 published first as pamphlets (QUARTOS)

These plays were not published until 7 years after he died -- in a FOLIO of 36 PLAYS (with an introduction by Ben Jonson) published by John Heminges and Henry Condell. (Another play "PERICLES" is also generally attributed to Shakespeare.)
